



MICKY BABY MOCCASINS

FINISHED SIZE: US BABY'S 1-5

Micky Baby Moccasins are baby booties in the style of moccasin shoes. Like real moccasins, these booties are suitable with casual attire all-year round, great for both indoor and outdoor wear. Micky Baby Moccasins made with brightly colored quilting weight cotton have a more playful look to them compared to when they are made with suede- the latter material will give this pattern of baby booties a more luxurious look, much like that of actual moccasins. These baby moccasins are the perfect handmade gift for your baby. Make these lovable shoes for your own son or daughter, and even for your baby nieces and nephews.

MATERIAL LIST

FABRIC

44" wide heavyweight home decorator OR quilting weight cotton

- (1/8) Yard for exterior fabric
- (1/8) Yard for lining

INTERFACING

(1/4) Yard of 22" wide medium weight fusible interfacing

NOTE:

- *No seam allowance is needed for the interfacing
- **Non-skid soles and other non-skid materials are recommended for the exterior sole piece
- ***CAUTION: Small children may choke on beads, buttons, and other small pieces if they come loose

OTHERS

1 Spool of coordinating thread1 color of embroidery thread2 of 1 cm Buttons

TOOL LIST

Ruler, Scissors, Chalk pencil, Pencil, Sewing machine, Pins, Needle, Shape tool

- * Seam allowance 1/4" unless otherwise specified.
- * All units are in inches.

Tweaking Option

If you want the shoes to have a tighter fit, fold the upper in half widthwise and pin along the heel on a slight angle, starting from the bottom heel corner and ending at about 1/4" from the heel seam at the top (or at the desired spot).

Then, sew along this angled line, rather than sewing along the given heel seam. Repeat this process for the other upper.





Cut out the Fabric

Draw the patterns directly onto the wrong side of a single layer of fabric. Because there is a right and left shoe you will need to reverse the sole pattern when tracing. Make sure the right and left pieces are separated to avoid confusion when attaching the soles. Cut out the exterior, lining, and interfacing. Fuse the interfacing on the wrong side of the exterior following the manufacturer's guide.

Fold the exterior upper in half widthwise so that its straight ends meet. Pin and sew the toes together, backstitching on both ends. Repeat for the other exterior upper and lining upper pieces, *see Picture 1*. Press the seams open. Turn the exterior uppers right side out, *see Picture 2*.

Place the lining upper piece on the exterior upper piece with right sides together, *see Picture 3.* Pin and sew the two pieces together by sewing around the center hole. Backstitch on the start and end points, *see Picture 4.* Clip the curved seam, *see Picture 5.* Sew the remaining upper in the same manner.



Assemble the Upper and Sole Lining

Turn the uppers right side out and press the top openings, see Picture 6. Place the lining upper piece and the lining sole with right sides together, matching their center points. Pin the toe and heel. Pin around the rest of the sole, clipping the heel seam as needed, see Picture 7. Then, sew the sole, backstitching on both ends, see Picture 8. Repeat for the other shoe.

Attach the Exterior Sole Piece

Flip the exterior upper piece so its right side is facing up, see Picture 9. Place the exterior sole piece on the upper with right sides together, matching their center points, see Picture 10. Pin the toe and heel. Then, pin around the rest of the sole, clipping the heel seam as needed. Sew the sole, backstitching on both ends. Leave a 2" gap for turning, see Picture 11. Make sure all the layers are included.



Clip the seams, see Picture 12. Turn the shoe right side out; pin and stitch the opening closed, see Picture 13. Repeat for the other shoe.

Sew the Top

Place an exterior top piece on a lining top piece with right sides together, see Picture 14. Sew the top pieces together, backstitching on both ends and leaving a gap for turning, see Picture 15. Clip the seam, see Picture 16. Turn the assembled top right side out and slipstitch the opening closed, see Picture 17. Repeat this process for the second top.

Attach the top to the shoe's upper using a blanket stitch. Stitch up to the folding line indicated on the pattern, see Picture 18. Fold down the upper top's flap so the lining is right side out and sew on the button, see Picture 19. Repeat for the other shoe.

*Because our patterns are on PDF files, the pages may be scaled prior to printing, depending on the printer and print driver. To ensure that the shoes pattern prints in the correct size, set the margins on zero before printing the pattern. To do so, select "None" from the "Page Scaling" drop-down list in Acrobat or Reader's Print dialog box (Hanyaloglu, 2007).

**The size of the shoes may also be affected by the thickness of your interfacing and/or fabric.

***The length of the shoes may slightly differ according to the shoes' shape

****The pattern sizes should match the following measurements upon printing:

Heel to Toe Length (in inches) (No seam included)

Baby Shoes

Size 1 (0-3 mos.): 4" Size 2 (3-6 mos.): 4.25"

Size 3 (6-9 mos.): 4.5"

Size 4 (9-12 mos.): 4.75"

Size 5 (12-18 mos.): 5"

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
