This classic man boxer shorts pattern makes a pair of very comfortable underwear for summer and an easy to make gift for Father's Day.



To print your PDF pattern



Your pattern pieces come at the end of these instructions. For accurate printing, please make sure you are using the latest version of Adobe Reader. You can <u>download the</u> latest version here if you need to.

Select File → Print and the print dialogue box opens. Under Page Sizing and Handling, select ACTUAL SIZE. Check the preview in the right hand side illustration. Select the page numbers you want to print. You can print the whole document, or just the pattern pieces.

On the edge of the top left page is a box you can use to test your printing. This box should measure 2 inches square. If yours is wildly different you will need to check your printer options to make sure the pages are not being resized.

Use the grey guides on the overlap of the sheets to match up the pattern pieces, folding under or cutting off any overlaps, tape together and cut out your pattern pieces.

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Materials

- 1 yard of 54" lightweight cotton
- thread to match
- 1 button or snap (optional)
- 1 1/5" wide elastic enough to go around the waist comfortably

Tools

- sewing machine (optional)
- seam ripper or a buttonhole puncher (optional)
- universal sewing machine or hand sewing needle
- erasable fabric pen
- a ruler to add the seam allowance


